2017 marks the centennial of women gaining the right to vote in New York State. Sessions being offered will focus on Women in New York history. Participants will learn ways to creatively integrate primary sources in the classroom. The following sessions offer CTLE credits:

***Burden of the Ballot* - performance**

*Burden of the Ballot* is a 25 minute, one-act play taking place in May 1917 at Cherry Hill in Albany. The play was written and devised using letters between Rankins of Cherry Hill and Dorry Scribner, a suffragette and family friend, as well as photographs, and suffrage and anti-suffrage writings of the period.

***Burden of the Ballot* - workshop**

Learn how to create dramatic projects from primary sources by exploring the inquiry process used to create the short play. Explore resources and methods for classroom implementation.

**Peter Picked a Primary Source**

The presenters will introduce the Student Research Award program, and explain how librarians, public historians, educators, and others can recruit and mentor students to participate in this research contest. The panelists will also share their experiences administering this program, working with students, and serving as project judges. Learn how the award is connected to the learning standards, explore and evaluate sample student projects.

**Votes for Women!**

Participants will be able to educate students about active participation in community issues by looking at the strategies used by women before they had the right to vote.

**Women's Rights in New York State**

Learn how to incorporate primary sources into the classroom using the inquiry method. Participants will be introduced to the inquiry on Women's rights in New York for the centennial of women's right to vote in New York State.
